- Summer Sermon Series- Our summer sermon series has been Blessings of Everyday Life. - **Bible Camp** We had several youth attend various bible camps including our affiliated Eastern North Dakota Synod bible camps: Red Willow and Park River. We always have scholarships available if any other children would like to attend bible camp.
- Weddings- This has been a busy summer with weddings. Most of these are former youth from Our Savior's. It is fun to share in such important milestones of life.

Summary of the 2024 Synod Assembly

On June 1-2, 2024, the Eastern North Dakota Synod, ELCA gathered together at the Holiday Inn in Fargo, ND for the thirty-seventh annual Synod Assembly under the theme of "Challenge: Learn, Discern, Respond." There were a total of 296 people in attendance (183 Lay Voting Members; 80 Rostered Minister Voting Members; 33 Visitors). The business items included hearing reports from officers, adopting the 2025 Synod Mission Plan (budget), elections for Synod Council, Committees, and Voting Members to the 2025 Churchwide Assembly, and adopting two resolutions. The resolutions were on Compensation and Benefit Guidelines for 2025 and a Reconciling in Christ Welcome Statement.

Participants also heard a State of the Synod from Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth and State of the ELCA from our churchwide representative, Kristen Opalinski. We had two worship services with an emphasis on our indigenous ministries in Opening Worship and care for creation at our Closing Worship with the Rev. Deborah Blood, UCC Conference Minister, preaching. Two keynote presentations were shared by Dr. Kelly Sherman-Conroy, Native Theologian. There were seven workshops offered for participants on a variety of topics.

Rostered Ministers and Congregations celebrating significant anniversaries were acknowledged. The <u>Strategic Plan</u> for the Synod was launched thanks to a year-long process of listening and discerning across the synod. A reception was held to celebrate <u>five new Endowment Funds</u> that have been created. The 2025 Synod Assembly will be held on June 7-8, 2025.

June 5, 2024 at 5:30 p.m.

- 1. Call to Order Noting a quorum, President Barb Hultin called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.
- 2. Devotions Pastor Joe Johnson led devotions.
- **3.** Confirmation of Agenda Jason Lovas moved to accept the agenda as presented. Brad Ydstie seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
- 4. Old Business
 - a. Synod Assembly Review. Six members of our congregation, Barb Hultin, Glen Hultin, Mike Tweten, Joy McSparron, Pastor Joe Johnson, and Pastor Amanda Johnson, attended the Eastern North Dakota Synod Assembly the first weekend of June. The assembly was a good experience. Barb Hultin was elected to serve as a Synod representative and Joy McSparron as alternate at the Churchwide Assembly in August 2025.

5. New Business –

- a. Custodial Contract. The Council reviewed the Custodian job description. Daniel Nelson moved to approve awarding the custodial contract to Derek Ehnert for \$18,000 per year. Jason Lovas seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
- 6. Pastor Joe's Report OSLC has had a lot to celebrate! In the past month we have celebrated; Amanda Johnson's graduation from Wartburg Seminary, Amanda Johnson's ordination at OSLC, Hillsboro Baccalaureate, Senior Recognition Sunday, and three baptisms. We also had two funerals and numerous pre-marriage counseling meetings. I have attended several church meetings including the Mayville conference pastor's meeting, Mayville conference caucus, and Eastern North Dakota Synod Candidacy Committee. Six of us from Our Savior's attended the Eastern North Dakota Synod Assembly June 1-2. I have seven more weddings scheduled that I am officiating this summer and fall. I will have vacation July 29-31 and August 12-15. The Youth Trip is July 13-22.
- 7. Treasurer's Report Jason Lovas updated the council on the financial state of the church. The month of May ended with expenses exceeding income by \$12,727. Year to date, income exceeds expenses by \$13,193. The media fund is at \$3,449. Beth Christianson moved to accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Teresa Forseth seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
- 8. **Deacons' Report-** Deacons continue to work with The Idea Shop on signage. There were some changes in the communion schedule in May.
- **9. Trustees' Report-** Mike Tweten emailed the list of projects the Trustees are currently involved in. The Council reviewed it.

We Are Also Citizens

June 14, 2024

The airwaves are filled with contentious political discourse. And, as we get closer to the November election, it will undoubtedly get louder and coarser. Each side seeks to catch the other with questions that aren't designed for clarity and dialogue but to further its own agenda. Martin Luther's explanation of the Eighth Commandment in the Small Catechism—"We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. *Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light"*— is barely visible in the rearview mirror.

But the "gotcha" question isn't a modern invention. "Then the Pharisees went and plotted to entrap him in what he said. ... Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to Caesar (the emperor) or not?" (Matthew 22:15-17). We know the answer. Jesus told them: "Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's and to God the things that are God's" (21).

This passage has been used to inform the relationship between the institutions of the state and the community of faith. In this relationship the authority of the state is real and respected—but limited. God's authority is acknowledged as ultimate and deserving of ultimate devotion and obedience, yet it doesn't necessitate withdrawal from or opposition to participation in civic life and its responsibilities. We Lutherans call this the doctrine of two kingdoms, and we understand that the church and the state, the spiritual and the temporal, are *both* established by God and are *both* part of God's twofold rule. Both church and state are good gifts from God.

Lutherans have been accused of congenital quietism. Our understanding of God's twofold rule and even the story about paying taxes in Matthew have been used to discourage participation in civic life. However, active participation in public life has been part of the Lutheran movement from its beginning. Lutherans don't withdraw from public life. In fact, the ELCA's constitution pledges us to "work with civil authorities in areas of mutual endeavor, maintaining institutional separation of church and state in a relation of functional interaction."

I have been voting for 51 years. I can't think of an election cycle more fraught and divisive than this one. People all across the political spectrum claim that life as we know it is on the line. It's not possible to agree to disagree—one must decide and put a stake in the ground. There is the potential for violence.

But division and violence don't have to be our inevitable future. On Nov. 5, no matter the outcome, we will still be here together. Our church, our people, our congregations will still be here and will witness that unity doesn't mean uniformity; that what binds us together is new life in Christ; that the church—and our country—are bigger than our "tribe"; and that baptism proves that water is thicker than blood.

This is not "both side-ism." Based on Scripture and the Confessions and forged through prayer, there are principles that aren't debatable: love, community, sacrifice for the common good, to name a few. Instead, we are free and forgiven in Christ so that even when we disagree on deeply held convictions, we can still see the other as someone for whom Christ died.

Something that is missed when reading the story of Jesus and taxes is what he reveals about God and the world God so loves. We focus on Caesar. If Caesar's image and title are imprinted on a base metal coin, a humanly created, literal graven image, where is God's image to be found? Human creatures—the living beings whom God created in God's own image, into whom God breathed the breath of life—are bearers of God's image in the world.

Dear church, our citizenship is ultimately in heaven. But we are also citizens of this country—this flawed, fractious, unequal, imperfect union. In U.S. political history, people have yearned and given their lives for what they had hoped for—democratic life for the sake of the flourishing of all. One of the ways we serve our neighbor is to participate in civic life. Can we see Election Day as a unifying event when the whole country goes to the polls?
