Matthew 2:1-12 - The Visit of the Magi

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the east came to Jerusalem, ² asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage."

The gift of the magi, the three kings, or the story of the wise men. No matter what you call it, it's a well-known story. - 1. Call to Order Noting a quorum, President Barb Hultin called the meeting to order at 12:31 p.m.
- Devotions Pastor Joe Johnson led dwelling in the word on the feeding of the 5,000 from Luke 9.
- **3. Confirmation of Agenda** Dan Nelson moved to accept the agenda as presented. Brad Ydstie seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

4. Old Business

a. Staff update- Linda Hawn will be done with her duties at OSLC after Christmas. Karen Alfson will also be stepping aside from her duties at OSLC. Council will diligently work on solutions.

5. New Business -

- a. Annual meeting date- Sunday January 26th, 2025 immediately after the 10:30 am service.
- 6. Pastor Joe's Report In October, 19 of our 10th graders attended a confirmation retreat in Detroit Lakes, made their confirmation stoles, and wrote faith statements. They presented their faith statements on Wednesday, October 23. They were confirmed on Sunday, October 27. Our fall sermon series "Won't You Be My Neighbor?" is going well with a focus on the neighbor and neighborhood. The sermon series will conclude with the start of Advent. I will be on vacation November 25-28, December 8, 26-31.
- 7. Pastor Amanda's Report October has been a busy month! Each Wednesday in October we held after school activities and classes for our 4th, 5th, and 6th grade students. Through these classes we focused on "Love of Neighbor" by teaching self-love, ways to welcome one another, how to be a host, and the love of God. Through this Wednesday ministry we saw the student attendance increase each Wednesday and when the month was over the children who had only previously attended Wednesdays began also attending Sunday school. We confirmed 19 sophomores in October, preparing them with a confirmation retreat, going over their faith statements, and meeting with each confirmand individually. Additionally, in October, I took part in my first call cohort meeting through the synod office. This is a place to find support and comradery during the first years of being newly ordained. Also, a small group of us were able to have technology training for our sound board and new computer set up. We had just the beginning of this technology information and plan to do additional training in November.
- **8. Treasurer's Report** Jason Lovas reported Year-to-date expenses are exceeding income by \$34,400. The balance of the media fund is \$4,225. Motion to approve treasurer's report made by Dan Nelson, seconded by Teresa Forseth, discussion, motion passed.



I am happy to report that we now have a report on the Women and Girls Literacy project in the Central African Republic. It is included in this month's report. Also a note from Bethany Krepela, Development Director, LPGM. We supported this program over the past year. It is our plan to support it again at the end of this year.

We have also supported the shipping of medical supplies through Global Health Ministries. Medical Supplies have been sent to Emmanuel {Gallo} medical facility through Global Health Ministries. CAR being a land locked country makes it more



difficult to get supplies delivered. They must be sent to Cameroon and then transported over land to CAR, We have the statistical report from GHM for 2023, as 2024 is still going on. We also have a note from Doug Cox, Executive Director of GHM. We hope to have sufficient money available to support this project as well.

Remember to keep the people and programs in CAR in your prayers and contribute to our Global Mission budget.

Literacy Program Improves Quality of Life of Women & Girls in the Central African Republic (CAR)

During a pivotal meeting in 2018, women leaders from the Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Central African Republic (ELC-CAR) emphasized that women's literacy was a top priority. They believed prioritizing literacy for women and girls would enhance their quality of life by creating income generating opportunities and by promoting dignity.

This discussion led to a literacy program pilot project for 80 women and girls in the cities of Bouar, Gallo, and Baboua.

The one-year pilot started this year, and our contact Jean Paul recently reported, "I am very impressed by the dynamism and motivation of the young girls and women." He also expressed that while participants mourn their missed opportunity to learn to read at a young age, they are determined to make up for lost time.

Pilot programs always come with great learning opportunities. Jean Paul let us know that many women couldn't attend sessions during busy agricultural periods, because women in CAR are deeply involved with farming and needed to prioritize planting and harvesting. The women and girls wanted to continue learning but also needed to provide for their families.

He has suggested lightening the future program schedule during busy farming periods, so that women aren't forced to choose between learning and supporting their families.

According to Jean Paul, the current participants wish to continue the program in 2025. In fact, many women and girls from other cities have reached out and requested similar programs closer to them.

Renewing the project and expanding to other cities will depend upon sustained financial support and prayers from partners like you.

"The women, through me, say thank you for this project that values them...Be blessed for the work you do for the valorization and dignity of women."

GLOBAL HEALTH MINISTRIES IMPACT REPORT 2023

2023 HIGHLIGHTS SHIPPING MEDICAL SUPPLIES

The Fair Market Value of medical supplies and equipment shipped by GHM in 2023 was more than \$4,400,000, weighing more than 151 tons.

GHM released one 40' sea container every month in 2023, sending vital medical supplies and equipment to waiting partners overseas. 193 different medical facilities and nursing schools received items on these shipments.

A significant shipment of equipment for Peace Clinic, on the outskirts of Monrovia, Liberia, empowered an important upgrade. Items, both donated and purchased, included everything from a digital x-ray machine and patient monitors to IV poles and GHM Newborn Kits, used by staff to encourage women to visit the clinic for perinatal care. New laboratory equipment provided better diagnostic tools to lab techs like Olivier, further building the clinic's capacity to heal. Curran Lutheran Hospital in Lofa County also received a digital x-ray machine, transforming patient care at the hospital.

Thank you from hundreds of thousands of people around the globe that your support strengthened last year! Enclosed is a booklet filled with photos, stories, and statistics of how your partnership has impacted the world through Global Health Ministries.















MONDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY
