

- 1. Call to Order Noting a quorum, President Barb Hultin called the meeting to order at 11:46 a.m.
- 2. **Devotions** Pastor Joe Johnson led us in devotions from Luke 2:41-47.
- **3. Confirmation of Agenda** Jason Lovas moved to accept the agenda as presented. Daniel Nelson seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

#### 4. Old Business

- a. Staff updates
  - i. Karen Alfson retired as our church organist. We have postings with Red River Valley Organists Guild and have reached out to area colleges.
  - ii. Linda Hawn has resigned as the church and bell choir director as she is moving. OSLC will envision how these groups move forward.
  - iii. OSLC is looking for a new custodian. Thank you to those who have helped during the interim. As we look for a replacement, volunteers are needed for cleaning and snow removal.
- b. 2025 Preliminary Budget Daniel Nelson moved to recommend a 2025 Budget of \$455,225 to the congregation at the annual meeting on January 26, 2025. Teresa Forseth seconded. All in favor, motion carried.
- c. Nominating Committee Update Barb Hultin will not be seeking re-election for President. Offices on the council up for election are President, Vice President, Secretary, one deacon, and one trustee. The Nominating Committee is working to find people feeling called to those offices.

# 5. New Business -

- 6. Pastor Joe's Report It has been another good year at Our Savior's Lutheran Church. The Advent theme *Star of Wonder* was well received. We had three Christmas Eve worship services including 1:30 p.m. at the Hillsboro Care Center, 3:30 p.m. and 5:30 p.m. at the church building. All three services were well attended. I attended Pastor Karin Moberg's retirement worship service and reception at Hickson Lutheran Church on December 8. OSLC hosted the Community Christmas Concert on Sunday, December 8. Choir Director Linda Hawn will be moving and has resigned from her staff position at church. We thank her for her years of service. We had the Sunday School Christmas program on Sunday, December 15 at the 10:30 worship service. On December 13 I met with the Eastern North Dakota Candidacy committee and conducted interviews. I finished the year with 6 vacation days (including one Sunday) that were unused and 3 continuing education days (including 1 Sunday) that were unused. I wish to express gratitude to all those on council and other volunteers who have served in many ways.
- 7. Pastor Amanda's Report December was of course busy. The Sunday school Christmas program on Dec 15th had 20 fourth through sixth graders participating in small group singing and speaking parts. For the first time, the children conducted the entire worship service from the opening song to the blessing and sending. It was a magical way to have worship. Additionally, about forty more children from three years through sixth grade sang in the Sunday school program choir. Beside the enormous task of putting on three Christmas eve services, we also followed up the "Won't You Be My Neighbor" theme, with the focus of "Star of Wonder" for our time of Advent and Sunday worship. This focus helped us look at ways to follow a path to Jesus just as the wise men followed the star.

The "Star of Wonder" theme culminated with everyone on Christmas Eve receiving a star word to follow Jesus into the new year. Lastly, I have continued to conduct hospital visits, planning for the new year, and pastoral care visits, as well as planning Sunday school lessons.

- 8. Treasurer's Report Jason Lovas reported that we ended 2024 even. We had very strong giving in December of more than \$85,000. OSLC now owns the property at 214 East Caledonia Avenue free and clear by borrowing money from ourselves. The balance of the media fund is \$3,739. Michael Bare made a motion to approve treasurer's report, seconded by Beth Christianson. Discussion. All in favor, motion carried.

- **1.** Call to Order Noting a quorum, Vice President Daniel Nelson called the meeting to order at 11:30 a.m.
- 2. Devotions Pastor Joe Johnson Luke 10:25-29 dwelling in the word
- **3. President's Report** Vice President Daniel Nelson led the meeting in the agreed upon Course of Conduct.
- 4. Pastoral Reports
  - a. Pastor Joe Johnson gave his report for the 2024 church year. How did we follow our mission statement of "Helping people experience the Love of God." He thanked the staff, volunteers, unpaid staff members, especially Karen Alfson and Linda Hawn. He noted raising up leaders in our congregation, including Nadia Robb-Kern and Pastor Amanda Johnson. He thanked outgoing members of the council for their service and gave an update on the parsonage and home next door to the church. A very sincere thank you to Our Savior's Lutheran Church. His report is on pages 5 and 6 of the 2024 annual report.
  - b. Pastor Amanda Johnson thanked the congregation for their support during seminary and ordination. Her full report is on pages 7 and 8 of the 2024 annual report.

- **6. Secretary's Report** Beth Christianson moved to suspend the reading of the 2024 meeting minutes as presented in the annual report. Jason Lovas seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried. Keith Meyer moved to approve the Secretary's Report as presented in the annual report. Joy McSparron seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

7. **Treasurer's Report** – Treasurer Jason Lovas presented the statement of income and expense. Income and expenses were balanced after a debit to the building expansion dedicated account for 2024. Jason noted that the loan for the house at 214 East Caledonia Avenue was paid off. Jason also noted that the budget was amended at the time of calling Pastor Amanda Johnson. The only debt that the church has at the moment is the snowblower which will be paid off this year. Jason asked if there were any questions on the statement of income and expenses. Ryan Opdahl moved that the treasurer's report be accepted as presented. Michael Bare seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

#### 8. Old Business

a. Council Secretary Term - The Council of Our Savior's Lutheran Church proposed the lowing change to the Constitution of Our Savior's Lutheran Church. The current wording in Article XI of the constitution is as follows:

Today is the third notification of this proposed change. This change passed by a majority vote at the annual meeting in January 2024 and needs a two-thirds majority at this meeting. Vice President Daniel Nelson asked if there were any questions concerning the proposed change, there were none at this time.

Krista Longthorne moved to accept the proposed change listed above. Jack Hansen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

### 9. New Business

- a. 2025 Budget Treasurer Jason Lovas presented the 2025 Budget. Jason asked if there were any questions on the proposed budget. A question was raised about the local missions budget which is for marketing to local people. A question was also raised about property taxes on the parsonage and home next door to the church. Jeremy Paulsrud moved to accept the 2025 budget of \$455,225 as presented. Vicki Buchholz seconded the motion. All in favor, motion carried.

P.S. Quality education begins with quality teachers. They build trust with students by treating them with respect and compassion, thereby keeping them in school and motivating them to aspire to their highest potential using their God-given gifts. Your gift will help train and support teachers, who are critical to the wellbeing of all children around the globe.

### **Global Health Volunteers**

This year, Global Health Ministries has launched an exciting new program to help the hands that heal. Many of GHM's international partners have shared with us their deep need for short-term capacity building. Global Health Volunteers is a direct response to those needs, creating opportunities for surgeons, nurses, midwives, palliative care specialists, administrators and others to serve with one of our partners overseas. GHM covers all costs for travel, food and housing for volunteers, who are in-country from 3 weeks to 3 months.

Ngaoundere Protestant Hospital in Cameroon and SALFA, the Lutheran health system in Madagascar, are both seeking volunteer surgeons. Ngaoundere is also seeking an orthopedist. The Lutheran School of Nursing in Madagascar has expressed a need for nursing faculty to teach specialized nursing skills, and Selian Hospice in Tanzania is seeking palliative care professionals to teach and mentor best practices for patient care and volunteer management. These short-term mission opportunities come out of GHM's deep relationships with partners, and commitment to sustainable health development.

#### **GO GOPHERS!**

GHM's Shipping program sends both purchased and donated medical equipment to international partners, helping them build their capacity to provide quality healthcare to surrounding communities. Donated equipment that in not new is tested before it is sent. This fall, GHM was contacted by a sophomore student in the biomedical engineering program at the University of MN, Twin Cities campus. Anita reached out to ask whether her class could partner with GHM to inspect and repair donated equipment. GHM said YES! The students have started with a pulse oximeter, EKG and patient monitor, testing and calibrating the machines, finding user and service manuals, sourcing and installing replacement batteries. When repairs are finished they'll certify the equipment and return it to GHM, ready to ship to our partners overseas. Go Gophers!

- all the thank-you's were read from our donations made.


